# THE FRANCE & MERRICK SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

A merit scholarship opportunity for talented undergraduates who have demonstrated potential for leadership in the area of civic engagement, especially to Baltimore City, and strong academic records.

You have been invited to apply for The France & Merrick Scholarship Program for 2013–2014. Administered by The Shriver Center at UMBC, The France & Merrick Scholarship Program provides educational funding for students with strong academic records and a commitment to civic engagement. Award winners participate in individual service commitments (based on their specific interests), and also help to strengthen the culture of service at UMBC.

#### **AWARDS**

Based on availablity, scholarships are distributed across the academic year.

Fellows receive a scholarship (not to exceed \$15,000 for MD students; and \$22,000 for out-of-state students) towards tuition, mandatory fees, and room & board expenses. The Fellows also serve as cochairs in convening group meetings for the France & Merrick Scholarship Program.

**Scholars** receive \$1,000 for the year, attend group meetings, and work with service sites throughout the school year.



#### 2013-2014 AWARD AVAILABILITY

The Shriver Center is currently accepting applications for **two Fellows** positions and **five Scholars** positions. Applicants **must** be U.S. Citizens.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS & DEADLINES**

Interested candidates must submit a France & Merrick Scholarship Program application, an **unofficial** copy of your academic transcript, and a two-page essay.

Application materials are due by 5:00PM on Wednesday, April 3th, 2013. Anything received **after** this date will not be considered. Shriver Center Staff will coordinate follow up interviews the week of April 8th, 2013, as needed. Decisions for 2013-2014 will be **made in the first week of May 2013.**
